What is a flipped classroom?

1. What has traditionally been done at school is done at home. Students watch content videos at home, take notes, and formulate questions.
2. What has been done at home is now done at school. Students do practice problems and application activities at school

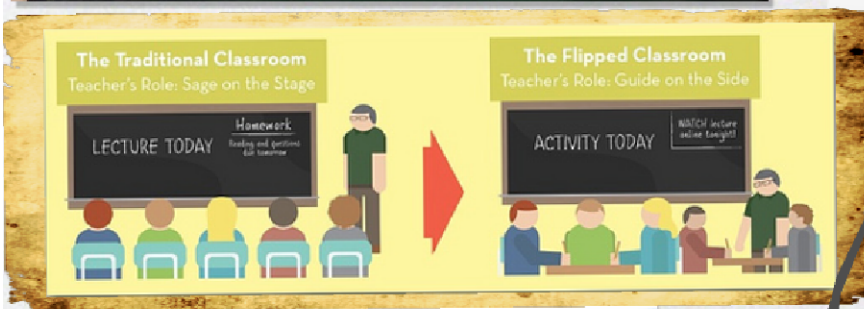

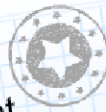


What will class look like?



Why flip a classroom:

1. More student engagement.
2. Students can watch and learn at their own pace.
3. Allows for differentiation.

2. Students have a comprehension check.
3. Then they either...
 - a. Practice and do more challenging tasks.
 - b. Practice to solidify the concept.
 - c. See the teacher to reteach.
